- b. Deliverables: The Ad Hoc Committee will present its recommendations at the May 18th meeting of the Research Working Group.
- c. Agency roles: ARB, CAL FIRE, CalEPA, and CEC will participate in the Ad Hoc Committee.
- d. Timeline: Done
- e. Crosscutting Issues: The members of the Ad Hoc Committee will consult with representatives from the other Working Groups also addressing research issues.

Task 2: Preparation of a Final Research Coordination Process

Purpose: The purpose of this task is to prepare a document describing the research coordination process.
